


Preventing Mother-to-Child Transmission

An HIV-positive mother is at risk of transmitting HIV to her child during pregnancy, labor, delivery and breastfeeding.



In 2011, with PEPFAR support, approximately

660,000

HIV positive pregnant women received antiretroviral treatment.

As a result:

In 2011, with PEPFAR intervention, approximately

200,000 CHILDREN

were born HIV-free.



PEPFAR's Goal: An AIDS-Free Generation

In 2011, PEPFAR reached nearly **4 million people** with treatment, laying a foundation for heightened efforts as we move forward.

By the end of 2013, PEPFAR will directly support more than

6 MILLION PEOPLE

on antiretroviral treatment – two million more than our previous goal.

GLOBAL PLAN GOAL: 90% REDUCTION IN NEW HIV INFECTIONS

In June 2011, PEPFAR and UNAIDS led an effort that outlined the Global Plan toward the virtual elimination of new pediatric infections and keeping mothers alive. This is a path toward achieving a **90% reduction in new HIV infections** among children and **halving AIDS-related maternal mortality** by 2015.

HIV counseling and testing for more than 40 million people



Antiretroviral treatment for more than 660,000 pregnant women, resulting in approximately 200,000 babies born HIV-free



Antiretroviral treatment for nearly 4 million people

Voluntary Medical Male Circumcision

VMMC is a one-time intervention that provides lifelong benefit, making it a smart investment

Why It Matters

Men's risk of HIV acquisition is **reduced by at least 60%** when VMMC is performed.

Since 2007, PEPFAR has supported VMMC for **more than 1 million** men around the world.
