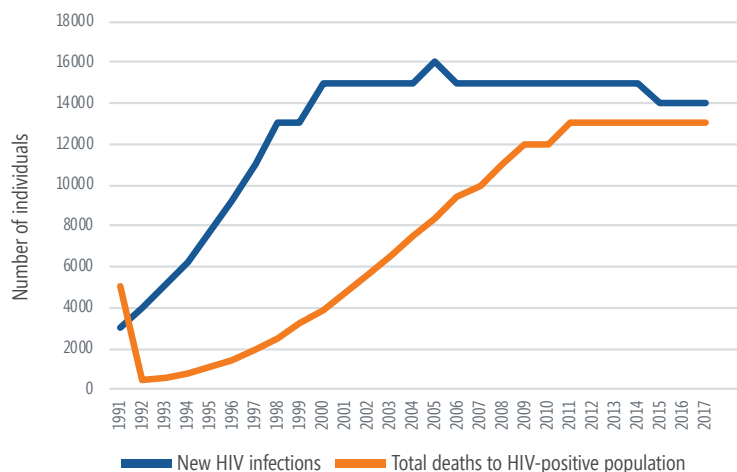


# South Sudan

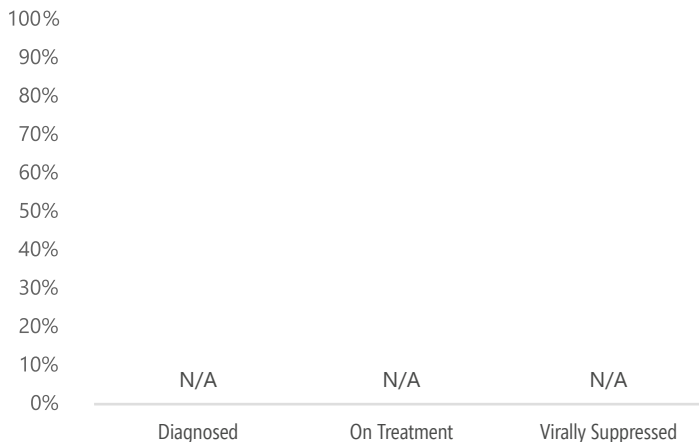
The U.S. government, through the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR), is partnering with the people and the Government of South Sudan to accelerate progress toward achieving HIV/AIDS epidemic control, with a focus on the following priorities:

- Accelerating the implementation of the national Test and Start policy, which aims to provide lifesaving antiretroviral treatment (ART) to all people living with HIV, including prioritization of pediatric HIV care and treatment
- Scaling up multi-month scripting of ART for stable patients living with HIV, allowing patients to have consistent access to medication even during conflict and displacement
- Scaling up targeted, high-yield HIV testing services modalities, including facility and community index testing and provider-initiated testing and counseling in high-yield locations such as tuberculosis clinics
- Establishing laboratory systems to initiate and ensure availability of viral load testing
- Continuing to provide care and support to orphans and vulnerable children (OVC), including ensuring linkages between OVC programs and care and treatment for children living with HIV
- Strengthening the South Sudan Ministry of Health's national surveillance, health information, data management, and monitoring and evaluation systems for improved monitoring and data-driven decision-making

## Progress Toward Reaching Epidemic Control



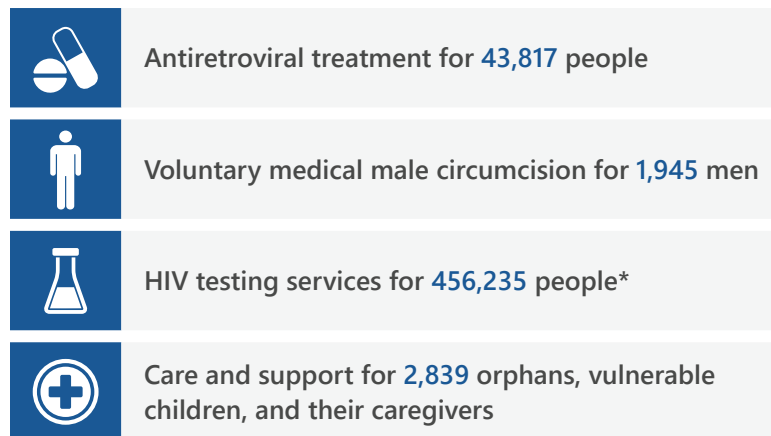
## Progress to UNAIDS 90-90-90 Targets in Adults



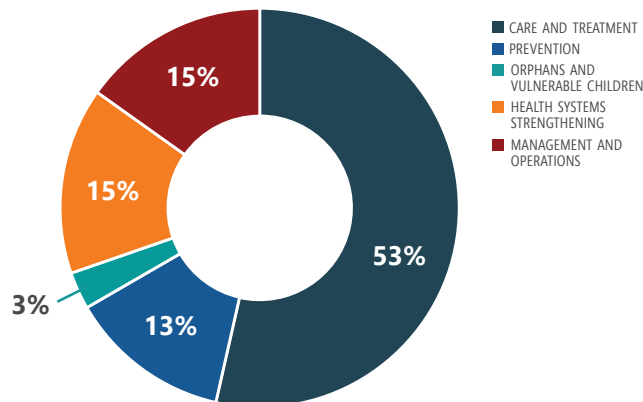
