

Lesotho

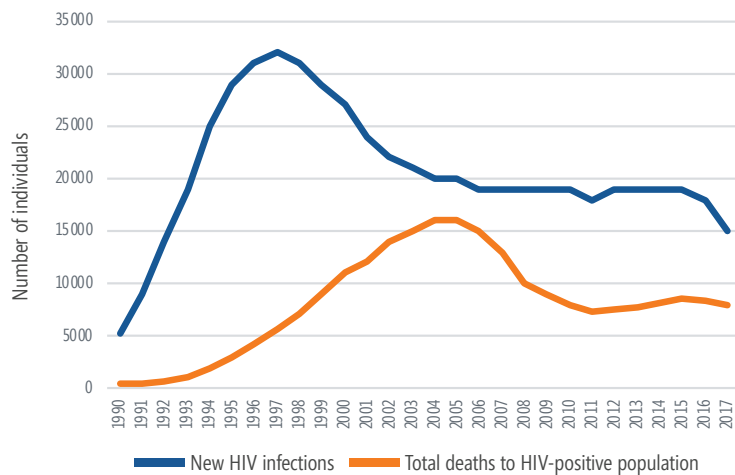
The U.S. government, through the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR), is partnering with the people and the Government of Lesotho to accelerate progress toward achieving HIV/AIDS epidemic control, with a focus on the following priorities:

- Expanding more efficient and effective testing strategies and treatment modalities, especially for adolescents and men
- Increasing Lesotho's coverage of lifesaving antiretroviral treatment (ART) to 90 percent nationally among all age and sex bands
- Supporting the scale up of evidence-based prevention activities among groups at the highest risk for HIV, increasing voluntary medical male circumcision coverage among young men, and emphasizing biomedical interventions including pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) for adolescent girls and

young women through services provided by the Determined, Resilient, Empowered, AIDS-free, Mentored and Safe (DREAMS) public-private partnership

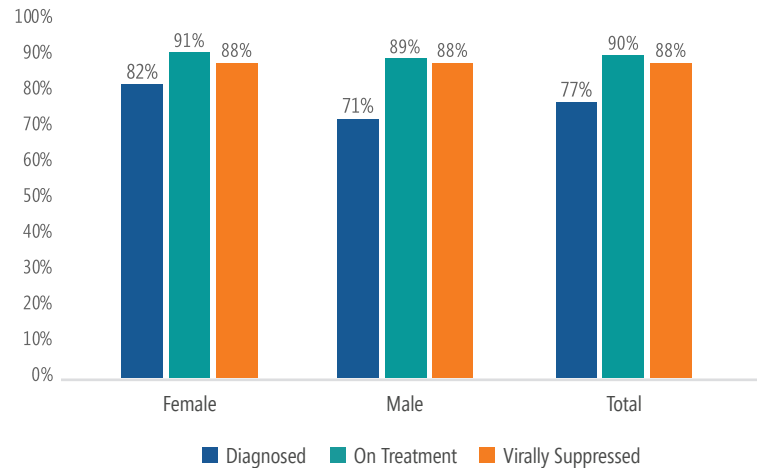
- Enhancing key populations prevention and treatment programming, including PrEP, by employing evidence-based strategies to identify HIV-infected key populations, especially men who have sex with men and female sex workers, and link them to ART services
- Implementing activities to strengthen national health information systems, laboratory services, human resources, and supply chain management

Cumulative PEPFAR Results in Lesotho (through June 2018)

- Antiretroviral treatment for **403,870** people
- Voluntary medical male circumcision for **82,910** men
- HIV testing services for **1,266,939** people*
- Care and support for **151,566** orphans, vulnerable children, and their caregivers
