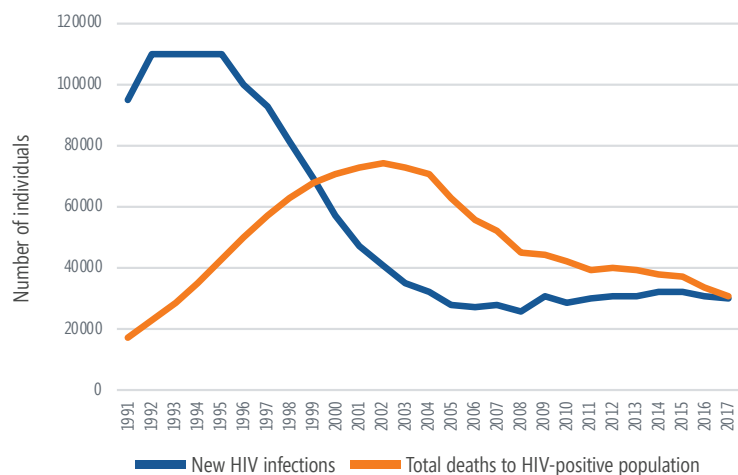


Côte d'Ivoire

The U.S. government, through the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR), is partnering with the people and the Government of Côte d'Ivoire to accelerate progress toward achieving HIV/AIDS epidemic control, with a focus on the following priorities to begin changing the course of their pandemic:

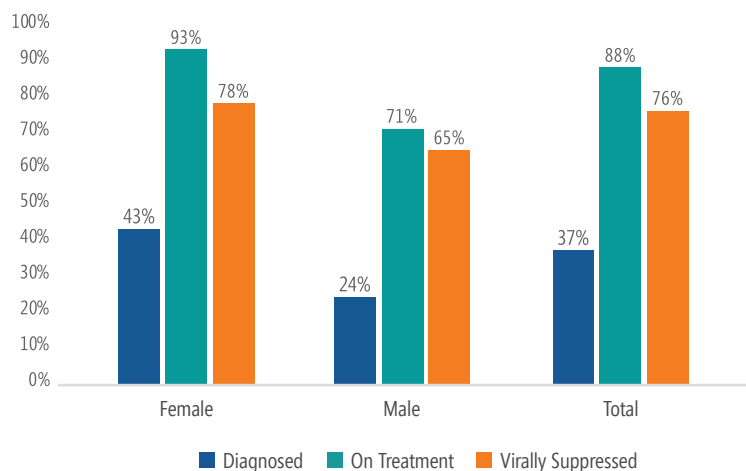
- Scaling up implementation of priority policies, including same-day initiation of lifesaving antiretroviral treatment (ART), differentiated models of care, community ART dispensing, multi-month ART scripting for stable patients, domestic ART procurement, and task-shifting
- Intensifying age-differentiated outreach and HIV testing services, including index testing and self-testing, for positive case identification of people living with HIV (PLHIV), especially among older men over age 25, adolescent young girls and women (AGYW), children, and key populations
- Increasing access to testing, care and treatment for pediatric patients and improving early infant diagnosis
- Enhancing prevention approaches for AGYW and orphans and vulnerable children (OVC) through Determined, Resilient, Empowered, AIDS-free, Mentored, and Safe (DREAMS) activities and the OVC platform
- Establishing HIV incidence surveillance system for newly diagnosed PLHIV to identify emerging populations and geographic areas at higher risk for HIV transmission.
- Advancing the use of site level data for routine site level performance monitoring of PEPFAR implementing partners
- Addressing public sector formal and informal fees that disproportionately impact the most vulnerable groups
