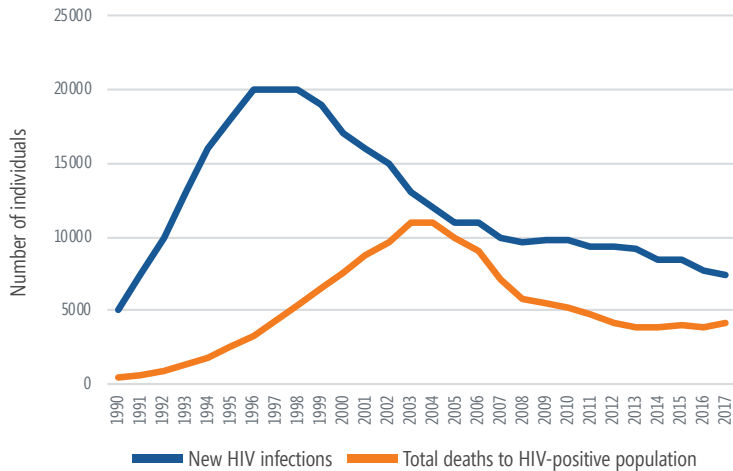
The U.S. government, through the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR), is partnering with the people and the Government of Namibia to accelerate progress toward achieving HIV/AIDS epidemic control, with a focus on the following priorities:

- Accelerating progress toward more than 81 percent antiretroviral treatment (ART) coverage across all age and sex bands in high HIV-burdened districts and ensuring over 90 percent of patients are virally suppressed by supporting Test and Start guidelines and utilizing differentiated models of care
- Supporting evidence-based prevention and testing activities among groups at highest risk for HIV, including men of all ages and women ages 15-24
- Protecting adolescent girls and young women from HIV infection by implementing a layered DREAMS-like

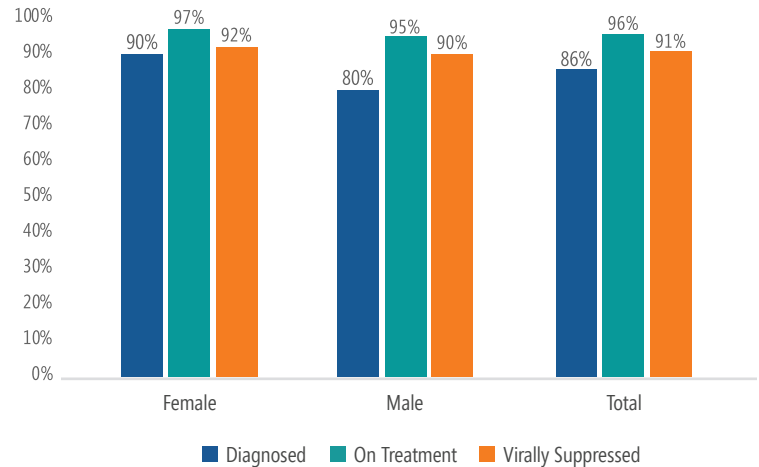
(supporting Determined, Resilient, Empowered, AIDS-free, Mentored, and Safe women) core package of services, including HIV and gender-based violence (GBV) prevention, post-GBV care, age-appropriate condom promotion, and provision of pre-exposure prophylaxis to those at risk

- Expanding voluntary medical male circumcision
- Screening for HIV and ART initiation in tuberculosis (TB) patients co-infected with HIV and strengthening TB screening and treatment in people living with HIV

Population-Based HIV Impact Assessment Progress to UNAIDS 90-90-90 Targets (15-64 years of age)



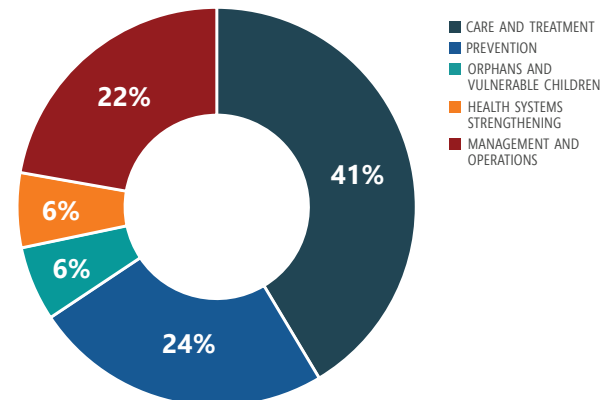

Cumulative PEPFAR Investment (FY2004-2018): \$1,023,438,289

Cumulative PEPFAR Results in Namibia (through June 2018)

- Antiretroviral treatment for **343,116** people
- Voluntary medical male circumcision for **131,006** men
- HIV testing services for **725,625** people*
- Care and support for **60,600** orphans, vulnerable children, and their caregivers
