The U.S. government, through PEPFAR, is proud to partner with the people and Government of Mozambique in accelerating Mozambique's progress toward achieving HIV/AIDS epidemic control. In Fiscal Year 2018, with a focus on 85 high-burden districts in Mozambique to maximize impact, the partnership will include the following specific priorities:

- Implementing Test and Start, the initiation of antiretroviral treatment (ART) for all people living with HIV, through innovative and more efficient service delivery models
- Identifying new HIV-positive individuals through optimizing provider-initiated testing and counseling in health facilities and index testing (contact tracing) in communities to better reach men and young people ages 15-29
- Scaling up evidence-based prevention services by enhancing the prevention of mother-to-child HIV transmission program, targeting men ages 15-29 with voluntary medical male circumcision, and increasing services in Determined, Resilient, Empowered, AIDS-free, and Safe (DREAMS) programs for vulnerable adolescent girls and young women
- Strengthening the health and social welfare system, including community structures to support orphans and vulnerable children and services targeting gender-based violence
- Enhancing key populations prevention and treatment programming by focusing primarily on female sex workers and their clients, men who have sex with men, and people who inject drugs
- Strengthening partnerships with community and civil society organizations to ensure programming that is both relevant, effective, and focused on the health needs of Mozambicans
