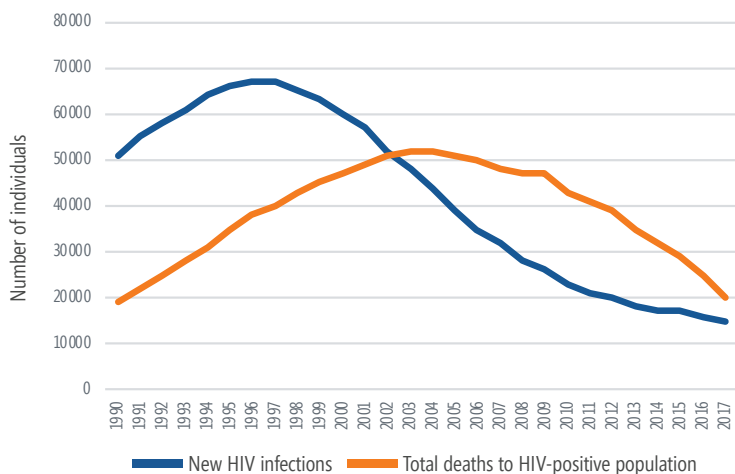


# Democratic Republic of Congo

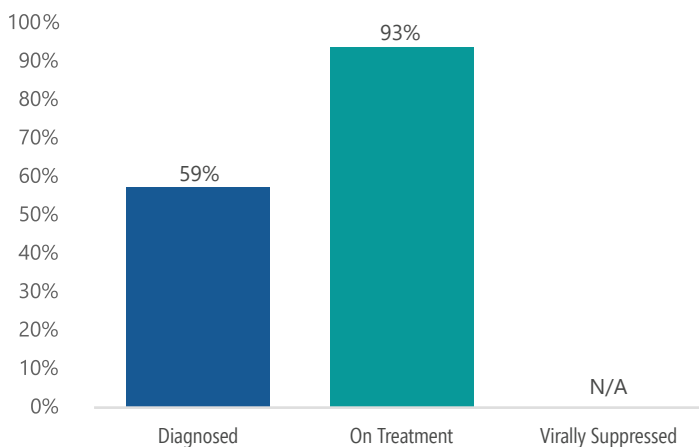
The U.S. government, through the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR), is partnering with the people and the Government of Democratic Republic of Congo to accelerate progress toward achieving HIV/AIDS epidemic control, with a focus on the following priorities:

- Rapidly expanding the provision of lifesaving antiretroviral treatment to all people living with HIV with the possibility of achieving epidemic control in the Haut Katanga and Lualaba provinces by the end of fiscal year 2019
- Expanding HIV index case testing to the entire treatment caseload instead of only newly positive cases as a means of closing treatment gap in the Kinshasa region
- Focusing on pediatric HIV care to increase the number of children on and adhering to treatment
- Continuing enhanced partner management that has led to program improvements including an over 60 percent increase in case finding in Kinshasa and reaching close to 70 percent treatment coverage in Haut Katanga and Lualaba

### Cumulative PEPFAR Results in Democratic Republic of Congo (through June 2018)

- Antiretroviral treatment for **159,776** people
- HIV testing services for **1,280,954** people\*
- Care and support for **72,555** orphans, vulnerable children, and their caregivers
