



Partnering to Achieve HIV/AIDS Epidemic Control

The U.S. government, through PEPFAR, is proud to partner with the people and Government of South Africa in accelerating South Africa's progress toward achieving HIV/AIDS epidemic control. In Fiscal Year 2018, with a focus on 27 high-burden districts in South Africa to maximize impact, the partnership will include the following specific priorities:

- Implementing the Universal Test and Treat policy, which aims to rapidly expand the provision of lifesaving antiretroviral treatment (ART) to all people living with HIV
- Focusing efforts in the highest-burden geographic districts and urban centers
- Supporting the scale-up of evidence-based prevention activities among populations most at risk for HIV – including adolescent girls, young women, and young men – through services provided by the Determined, Resilient, Empowered, AIDS-free, Mentored and Safe (DREAMS) public-private partnership
- Increasing voluntary medical male circumcision program coverage among target age groups
- Accelerating HIV treatment service delivery through direct support of human resources for health
- Supporting the adoption of differentiated care for stable patients, particularly at congested, high-volume facilities
- Investing in health systems strengthening initiatives, including the harmonization of information systems, improvement of laboratory services, and strengthened supply chain management
- Scaling up high-yield HIV testing services modalities, including facility and community index testing
- Aligning community-based interventions with facility-based support and rolling out evidence-based interventions to enhance treatment adherence and retention
