The U.S. government, through PEPFAR, is proud to partner with the people and Government of Indonesia in accelerating Indonesia's progress toward achieving HIV/AIDS epidemic control. In Fiscal Year 2018, with a focus on the priority areas of Jakarta and Papua, the partnership will include the following specific priorities:

- Improving data collection, quality, and use to demonstrate progress on achievement of the UNAIDS 90-90-90 targets, especially among targeted populations, by scaling up efforts to identify people who are HIV positive, enrolling them into care, and retaining them on treatment
- Improving access to the continuum of prevention and treatment services to achieve control of the epidemic
- Ensuring that people reached and diagnosed with HIV are enrolled in and retained on treatment by emphasizing the quality and uptake of HIV services
- Strengthening the linkage between civil society organization and health facilities to reach and retain targeted populations in the continuum of prevention, treatment, and care
- Reducing stigma and discrimination and violence against vulnerable populations through documenting baseline measures and establishing alliances between vulnerable population networks and civil society organizations
- Establishing a tracked referral system to link prevention and outreach efforts to testing systems
- Focusing on improving data quality, reporting, analysis, and utilization to support the national and local governments' programming and monitoring efforts
- Utilizing high-quality data to inform program and advocacy decisions that increase the number of people living with HIV entered and retained in HIV treatment and care
