

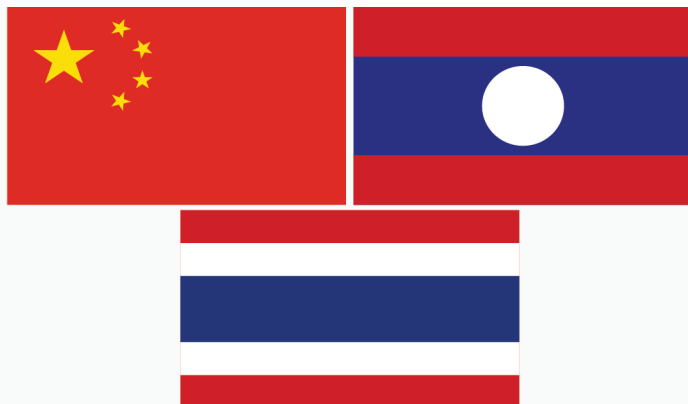


Partnering to Achieve HIV/AIDS Epidemic Control

Total PEPFAR Investment (FY 2009-2017): \$80,234,000

The U.S. government, through PEPFAR, is proud to partner with the people and governments of the Asia Region in accelerating their progress toward achieving HIV/AIDS epidemic control. In Fiscal Year 2018, with a focus on China, Laos, and Thailand, the partnership will include the following specific priorities to maximize impact:

- Catalyzing broad, sustained epidemic control by demonstrating effective approaches to reach, test, treat, and retain men who have sex with men, transgender women and other key populations in settings with the greatest burden of HIV
- Working with civil society and government partners to pilot and with government to scale innovative interventions
- Establishing domestic financing mechanisms for non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and systemizing their role in the health system
- Focusing on geographic areas and populations where HIV transmission is the highest and committing to advancing strong, sustainable national and regional responses to the HIV epidemic
- Advancing domestic investments in civil society leadership and ending Thailand's dependence on support from the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria
- Expanding access to pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) in priority provinces through client-centered community and public HIV services that meet quality standards and are cost-effective to deliver and sustain
- Ensuring local and national providers have access to data to help them effectively plan programs and make timely clinical-care decisions
- Providing key technical assistance and facilitate knowledge sharing, among countries in the Asia Regional Program and beyond

PEPFAR Results in the Asia Region¹ (through September 2017)

-  **Antiretroviral treatment for 15,946 people**
-  **Reached 109,336 members of key populations with HIV interventions**
-  **HIV testing services for 130,160 people**
