The U.S. government, through PEPFAR, is proud to partner with the people and Government of Burma in accelerating Burma's progress toward achieving HIV/AIDS epidemic control. In Fiscal Year 2018, with a focus on four high-burden states in Burma to maximize impact, the partnership will include the following specific priorities:

- Accelerating progress toward attaining the UNAIDS 90-90-90 targets through HIV program planning and prioritization with a focus on technical assistance
- Focusing efforts to improve the cascade of HIV prevention, testing, and treatment, especially for key populations affected by high HIV prevalence and those with limited access to and low coverage of HIV services
- Strengthening laboratory, health information, and supply systems to sustain Burma's HIV/AIDS programming in the long term
- Increasing HIV testing among key populations, as well as early enrollment and high rates of retention in treatment services for those who are HIV-infected
- Expanding harm reduction services and medication-assisted therapy, as well as improving case detection and linkage to treatment for people who inject drugs
- Scaling up HIV programming and resources by capitalizing on site-level "incubator" innovations and service delivery models
- Enhancing collaboration with all key in-country actors to identify cutting-edge solutions to national epidemic control challenges
- Investing in new initiatives and working to scale the solutions that promise the greatest impact for those who are HIV-infected
