The U.S. government, through PEPFAR, is proud to partner with the people and Government of India in accelerating India's progress toward achieving HIV/AIDS epidemic control. In Fiscal Year 2018, with a focus on 17 high-burden districts in India to maximize impact, the partnership will include the following specific priorities:

- Accelerating progress toward attaining the UNAIDS 90-90-90 targets by reaching, testing, and treating undiagnosed cases among key populations in high priority sub-national units
- Scaling up technical assistance, particularly high-impact interventions to reach, test, treat, and retain key populations, which include men who have sex with men, female sex workers, people who inject drugs, and transgender people
- Strengthening laboratory systems and processes and improving the quality, availability, and use of strategic information
- Demonstrating models to deliver optimal care and treatment services for people living with HIV, including Test and Start, which aims to rapidly expand the provision of lifesaving antiretroviral treatment to all people living with HIV
- Building up institutional and human capacity to scale up innovations on the prevention to care and treatment continuum
- Facilitating greater and timely dissemination of data that will ensure best practices from successful models be documented and scaled up
- Identifying new ways to strengthen partner organizations in the community and building greater capacity among health providers
- Tracking the epidemic to identify specific high HIV transmission areas to facilitate strategies to reach these populations
- Improving data sharing and access by building quality data systems and strengthening surveillance to track HIV cases
